Position Overview:

The Crisis Intervention Worker will provide quality care to children and youth and will ensure the safety of the clients we serve.

The Crisis Intervention Worker position is defined on a flexible scheduling basis with the opportunity to work either part time or full time hours. The identified wage range starts at \$17.00 to \$19.00 per hour depending on education and experience. The \$2.00 shift premium is paid for weekend shifts. Benefits are available after three (3) months of continuous service and a twenty (20) hour week is maintained on a consistent basis.

Responsibilities:

The Crisis Intervention Worker will provide immediate assistance to the primary caregiver or provide temporary care for the child or youth. Assistance will be provided at various shift locations including the Crisis Unit, group homes, biological homes and an emergent sibling set placement shelter. The primary focus of the position is to de-escalate crisis situations as they occur and mediate the situation in order to stabilize the situation until more permanent modifications can be implemented. The Crisis Worker will also ensure that the nutritional health, physical safety and well being of each client is maintained. Shift notes are required to be completed at the end of each shift and submitted within the proper timelines.

Qualifications:

The successful candidate will have a diploma/degree in a Human Services Field or two (2) years experience working with children and youth. The following current certificates are required upon hire or will be acquired within the first 3 - 6 months of employment at the employee's expense: First Aid/Level C CPR, Suicide Intervention, Critical Response and Aboriginal Awareness. A Security Clearance Check, Intervention Record Check and Drivers Abstract that are no more than 6 months old are also pre-employment conditions. A valid driver's license and reliable vehicle is preferred.
